Introduction to Simple Present Tense

What is the Simple Present Tense?

The simple present tense is used to describe habits, routines, and general truths. It is formed using the base form of the verb, with the addition of -s or -es for the third person singular.

- Example: I **go** to school every day.
- Example: She **studies** English every day.
