Essential Questions & Big Ideas

Essential Questions:

- What are the three basic types of sentences?
- How can we identify and classify sentences?

Enduring Understandings:

- Declarative, interrogative, and exclamatory sentences have distinct characteristics and uses.

Pre-Lesson Preparation

Room Setup:

- Arrange desks in groups of 4-5 students.
- Prepare multimedia equipment and ensure internet connection.

Detailed Lesson Flow

Send a letter or email to parents/guardians explaining the lesson and asking for their support in reinforcing the concepts at home.

- · What went well?
- What would I change?
- Next steps for instruction?

Glossary of Key Terms:

- Declarative sentence: A sentence that states a fact or opinion.
- Interrogative sentence: A sentence that asks a question.
- Exclamatory sentence: A sentence that expresses strong emotions.

Examples of Sentence Types:

- Declarative: The sun rises in the east.
- Interrogative: What is the capital of France?
- Exclamatory: What a beautiful day!
