Pre-Lesson Preparation

Room Setup:

Detailed Lesson Flow

Opening/Hook (10 mins)

Engagement Strategies:

- Ask students to share their thoughts and opinions on the video
- Use think-pair-share to facilitate discussion

Direct Instruction (20-25 mins)

- Provide a brief overview of YouTube and its features
- Explain the importance of digital citizenship and online safety

Checking for Understanding:

- Ask students to complete a quiz on the material
- Use a graphic organizer to check for understanding

Guided Practice (25-30 mins)

- Have students work in pairs to complete a guided practice activity
- Provide feedback and support as needed

Scaffolding Strategies:

- Provide a step-by-step guide for the activity
- Offer one-on-one support for struggling students

Independent Practice (20-25 mins)

- Have students work individually to complete an independent practice activity
- Allow students to choose from a variety of activities

Closure (10 mins)

- Review the key points learned during the lesson
- Ask students to reflect on what they learned

YouTube is a video-sharing platform where users can upload, share, and view videos

YouTube has over 2 billion monthly active users and is the second most visited website in the world

History of YouTube

YouTube was founded in 2005 by three former PayPal employees

YouTube was acquired by Google in 2006 for \$1.65 billion

Features of YouTube

YouTube allows users to upload videos up to 12 hours long

YouTube has a variety of features, including playlists, channels, and live streaming

Why Create a YouTube Channel?

Creating a YouTube channel allows users to upload and share their own videos

A YouTube channel can be used to showcase creativity, share knowledge, and build a community

Go to youtube.com and sign in with a Google account

Click on the "Sign in" button and follow the prompts to create a channel

Upload a profile picture and banner to your channel

Write a bio and add keywords to your channel

Go to youtube.com and sign in with a Google account

Click on the "Upload" button and follow the prompts to upload a video

Use keywords and tags to optimize your video for search

Write a compelling title and description for your video
