Common Punctuation Marks

Period (.)

Indicates the end of a complete sentence.

Example: I love learning about punctuation.

Comma (,)

Separates items in a list, sets off phrases, and creates pauses.

Example: I bought apples, bananas, and oranges.

Question Mark (?)

Used at the end of a direct question.

Example: Would you like to learn more about punctuation?

Advanced Punctuation

- Apostrophes show possession or create contractions
- Quotation marks highlight direct speech or special terms
- Exclamation points express strong emotion
