

Introduction

This worksheet is designed to assess students' understanding and application of phrases of time in the context of English Language Arts. The activities and questions in this worksheet are tailored for 15-16 year old students and aim to evaluate their ability to understand and use vocabulary related to time phrases, identify and explain the correct usage of phrases of time in sentences, and apply phrases of time in context to convey meaning and purpose in writing and conversation.
