Pre-Lesson Preparation

Introduction to Courage and Sacrifice

What is Courage?

Courage is the ability to do something that frightens one; it is the willingness to face danger, difficulty, or pain without fear.

- Physical courage: the ability to face physical danger or pain
- . Moral courage: the ability to stand up for what is right, even if it is difficult or unpopular

What is Sacrifice?

Sacrifice is the act of giving up something valuable or important for the sake of something else; it is the willingness to surrender one's own interests or desires for the benefit of others.

- Personal sacrifice: giving up one's own interests or desires for the benefit of others
- Ultimate sacrifice: giving up one's life or well-being for the benefit of others

Examples of Courage and Sacrifice

- Aslan's sacrifice in "The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe"
- · The Pevensie children's bravery in the face of danger
- · Real-life examples of courage and sacrifice, such as firefighters or medical professionals



Summary of "The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe"
