



## Introduction to Greetings

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Welcome to our lesson on basic greetings! In this activity, we will learn how to introduce ourselves and greet others using simple expressions. Can you think of a time when you met someone new? How did you feel? What did you say?

## Activity 1: Introduction Role-Play

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Divide the class into pairs and have them practice introducing themselves to each other. Use the following script:

- "Hello, my name is [name]."
