2. Explain the concept of offside in football. (6-8 sentences)

3. Discuss the importance of teamwork in football, providing examples of how different positions work together. (8-10 sentences)

4. What is the name of the player who kicks the ball to start the game?

5. Describe the role of a defender in football. (6-8 sentences)

Foundation:

- Goal

- Penalty area

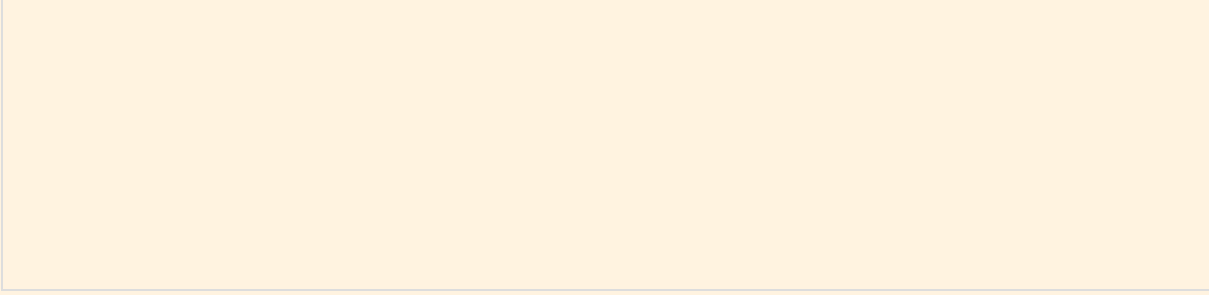
Core:

Marking Guide

The following marking guide will be used to assess your performance:

- Multiple Choice Questions: 1 mark for each correct answer
- Short Answer Questions: 4-6 marks for foundation, 6-8 marks for core, and 8-10 marks for extension
- Diagram Labeling: 4 marks for foundation, 6 marks for core, and 8 marks for extension
- Critical Thinking Questions: 8-10 marks for extension, 6-8 marks for core, and 4-6 marks for foundation

Differentiation Options

The following differentiation options will be available:

- **Foundation:** Visual aids, such as diagrams or pictures, will be provided to support understanding. One-to-one support will be available during the assessment.
- **Core:** Guided notes or a word bank will be provided to assist with short answer questions. Students will be allowed to work in pairs to complete the diagram labeling section.
- **Extension:** Additional challenges, such as designing a football strategy or creating a poster about a specific football topic, will be provided. Students will be encouraged to work independently and think critically.
