Introduction to Idioms
Welcome to this interactive worksheet on identifying and interpreting idioms in different cultural contexts! This activity is designed for 14-year-old students to develop their language skills, cultural awareness, and critical thinking.
Idioms are phrases or expressions that have a figurative meaning that is different from the literal meaning of the individual words. They are often used in informal language and can be culturally specific.
