Answer Key:

1. The verb "run" should be "runs" (subject-verb agreement)
2. The verb "drive" should be "drove" (tense consistency)
3. The verb "give" should be "gave" (tense consistency)

Activity 4: Punctuation and Capitalization

Correct the punctuation and capitalization errors in the following sentences:

1. the dog runs quickly
2. The car drove down the street, and the driver was happy
3. the teacher gave the student a homework assignment

Answer Key:

1. The dog runs quickly. (capitalization)
2. The car drove down the street, and the driver was happy. (punctuation)
3. The teacher gave the student a homework assignment. (capitalization)
