

Task: Divide into small groups and assign each group a different scenario:


- A patient is being discharged from the hospital and requires follow-up care.

Role-play the scenario, demonstrating effective communication and teamwork among hospital team members.


Activity 5: Research Project

Task: Research and create a presentation on a specific role within the hospital team, such as a doctor, nurse, or allied health professional. Discuss their:

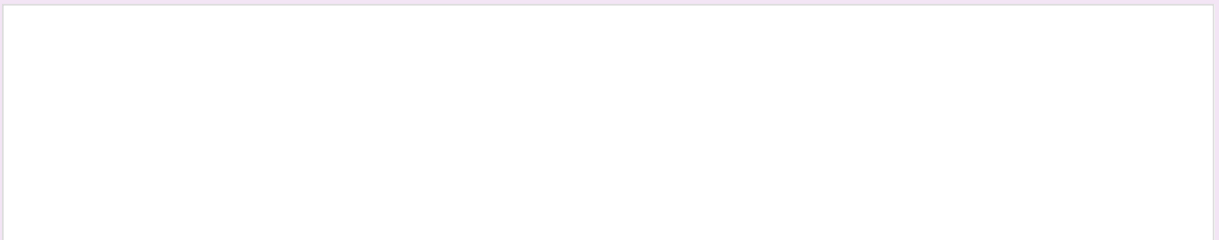
