What is a Noun?

A noun is a word that represents a person, place, thing, or idea.

Noun Classification Exploration:

Noun Type	Definition	Example
Proper Nouns	Specific names of people, places, or things	Bangkok, Sarah, Microsoft
Common Nouns	General names for things	city, person, company
Collective Nouns	Groups of things or people	team, family, class

Verb Tense Exploration

Verb Tense Detective:

Understand how verb forms change to indicate time and action.

Tense	Structure	Example
Simple Present	Base form of verb	I walk to school
Present Continuous	am/is/are + verb-ing	I am walking to school
Simple Past	Verb + ed	I walked to school
