Language Level	Description Complexity	Example
Basic	Simple Adjectives	"John is tall."
Intermediate	Comparative Descriptions	"John is as tall as a basketball player."
Advanced	Metaphorical Language	"John towers like a redwood, his presence filling the room with quiet strength."


### Sensory Description Workshop

### **Cultural Description Comparison**

Culture	Description Style	Example
Western	Direct and Specific	"Sarah is 5'6", with brown hair and blue eyes."
Eastern	Contextual and Relational	"Sarah moves with grace, like her mother, and carries herself with quiet confidence."

### **Emotional Intelligence in Descriptions**
