Pre-Lesson Preparation

Room Setup:

- Arrange desks in a U-shape to facilitate group discussion.
- · Set up a projector and screen for presentations.

Detailed Lesson Flow

- · Provide guided practice activities.
- Circulate around the room to provide support and feedback.

Scaffolding Strategies:

- Graphic organizers.
- · Sentence frames.

Independent Practice (20-25 mins)

- Provide independent application activities.
- Allow students to work independently and apply the reading comprehension and writing skills learned in the lesson.

Closure (10 mins)

- Summarize the key points of the lesson.
- Ask students to reflect on what they learned.

- Provide one-on-one support and feedback.

- Create a visual project, such as a infographic or comic strip, to illustrate the main ideas and supporting details of a text.

Encourage parents/guardians to ask their child about the lesson and what they learned, and to provide feedback and support at home.

Introduction and Hook (5 minutes)

Introduction:

Introduce the topic of reading comprehension and writing skills, and provide a hook to grab students' attention.

Hook:

Ask students to share a time when they had to read and understand a complex text, and how they felt about it.

Teaching Tips:

- Use a visual aid, such as a diagram or chart, to illustrate the importance of reading comprehension and writing skills.
- · Ask students to share their own experiences with reading and writing.
- Provide a clear and concise overview of the lesson objectives and activities.



Explicit Instruction (10 minutes)

Explicit Instruction:

Provide explicit instruction on reading comprehension strategies, such as identifying main ideas and supporting details, making inferences, and summarizing texts.

Visual Aids:
