Activity 1 - Nile River's Impact on Agriculture

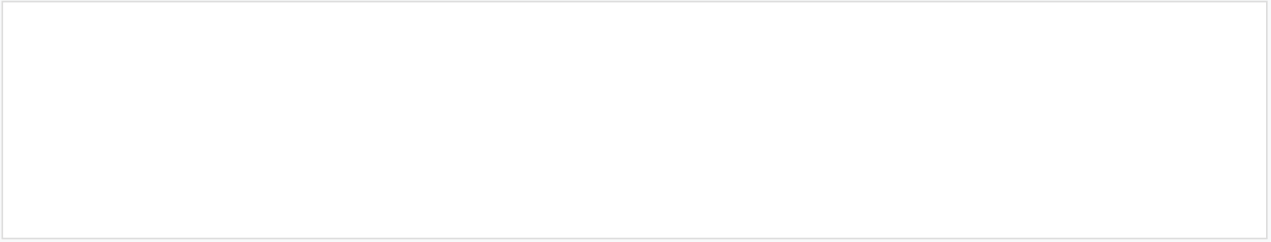

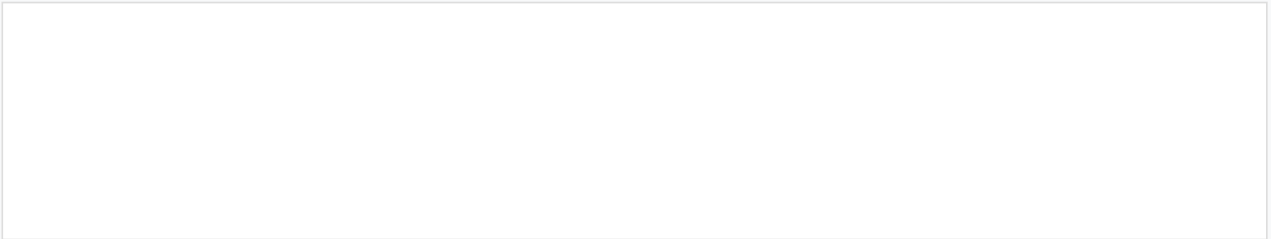

Task: Design a poster or infographic that highlights how the Nile River contributed to ancient Egyptian cultural achievements.

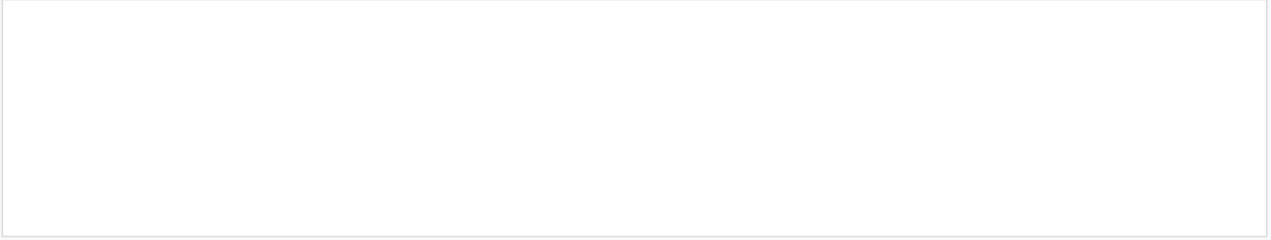
Questions to Consider:

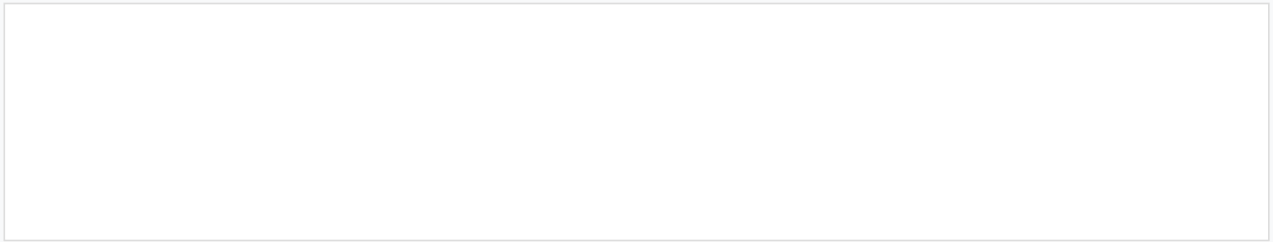

Task: Create a simple map of the ancient Egyptian trade routes, focusing on how the Nile River facilitated trade within the region and with neighboring countries.

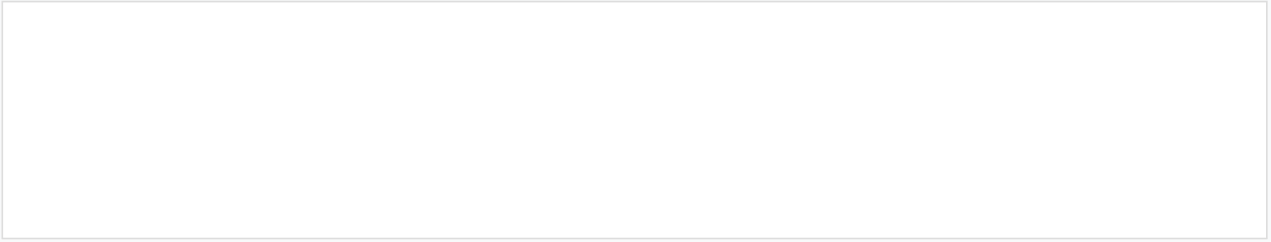
Questions to Consider:
