Character Profile

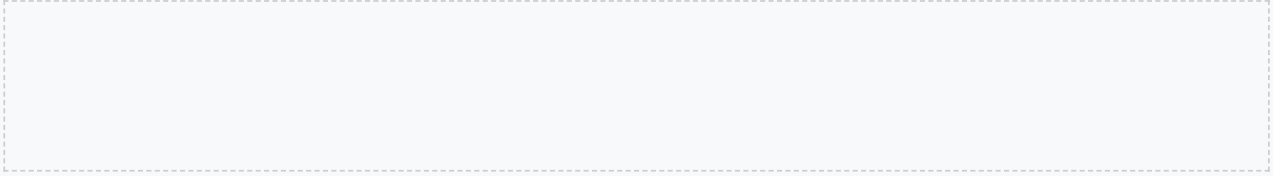
Create a character profile by answering the following questions:

Setting Description

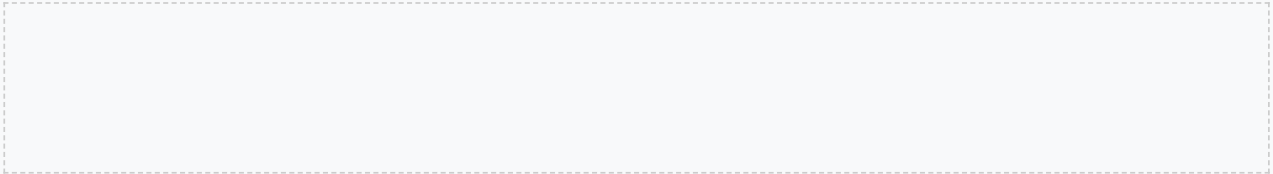
Imagine you are in a magical forest. What do you see, hear, smell, taste, and feel?

Dialogue and Description

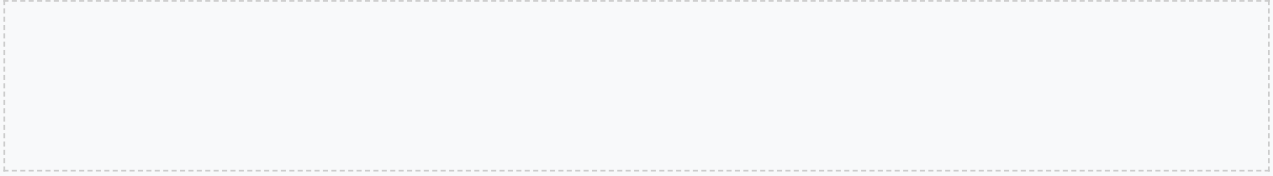
Write a short dialogue between two characters. What do they talk about? What do they learn from each other?

Practice writing descriptive passages about your character and setting. Use sensory details to bring the scene to life.

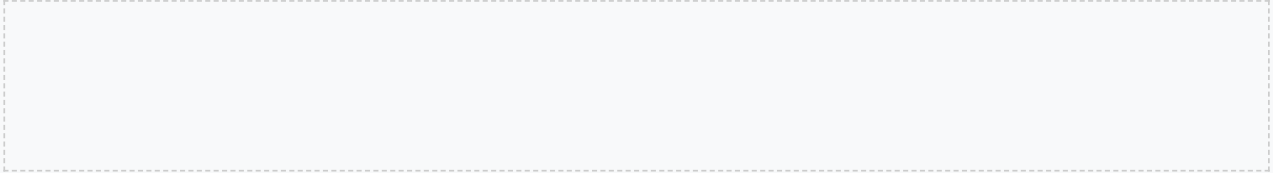
Draw a picture of the characters and add a short description.

Story Writing

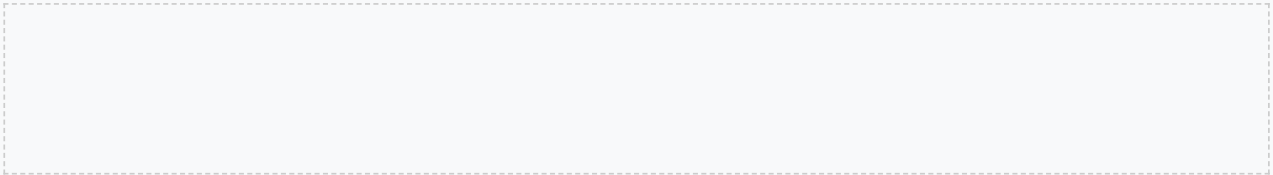
Write a short story using the characters and setting you have created. What is the main conflict or challenge? How do the characters overcome it?

Reflection and Feedback

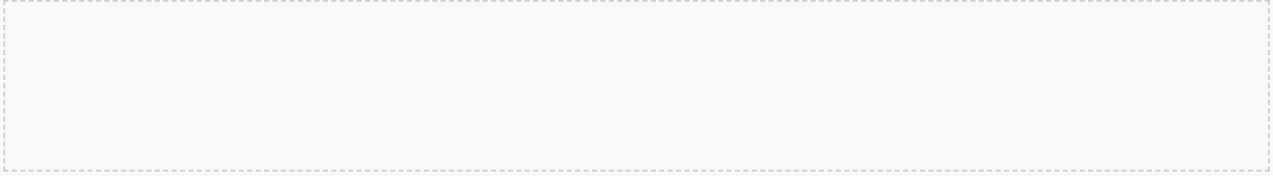
Reflect on what you have learned about character and setting development.

What did you find challenging? What did you enjoy?

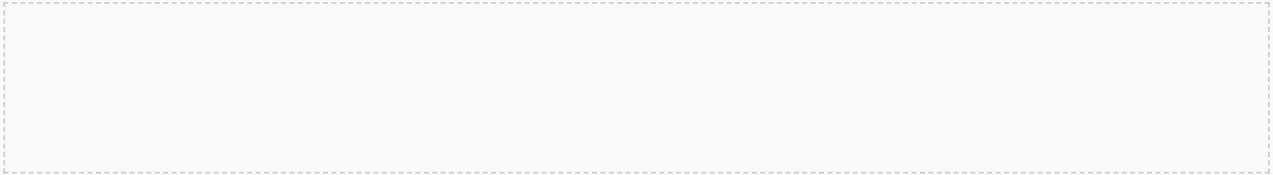
Ask a friend or family member to read your story and provide feedback. What do they like about your story? What suggestions do they have for improvement?

Creative Writing

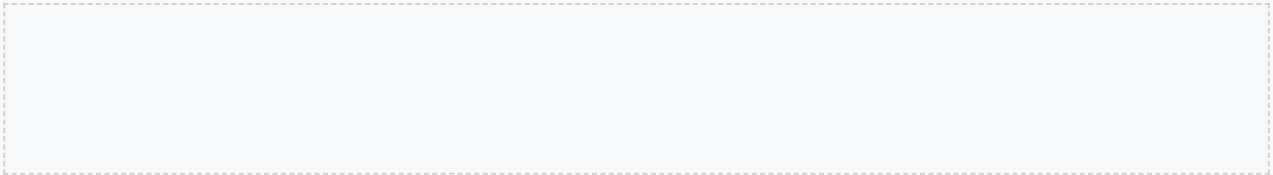
Write a creative piece using the characters and setting you have created. What genre is your story? What themes do you explore?
