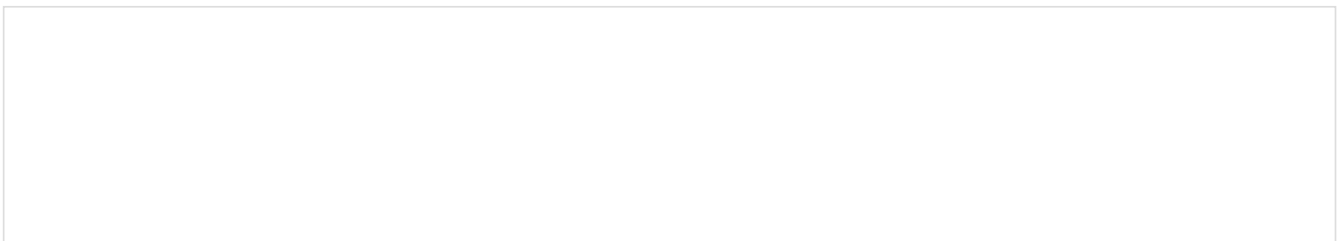
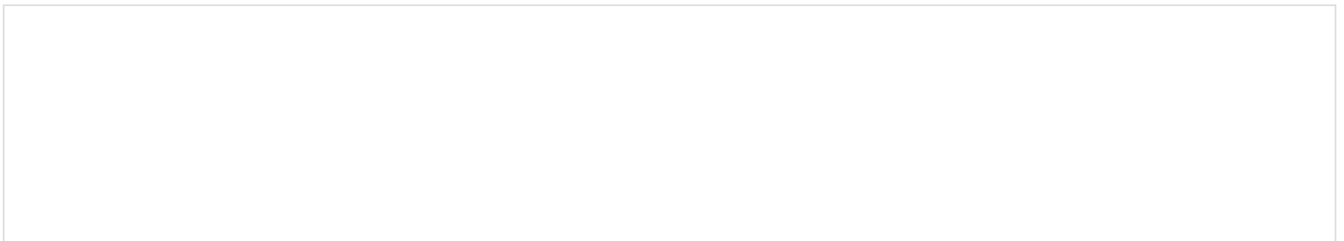
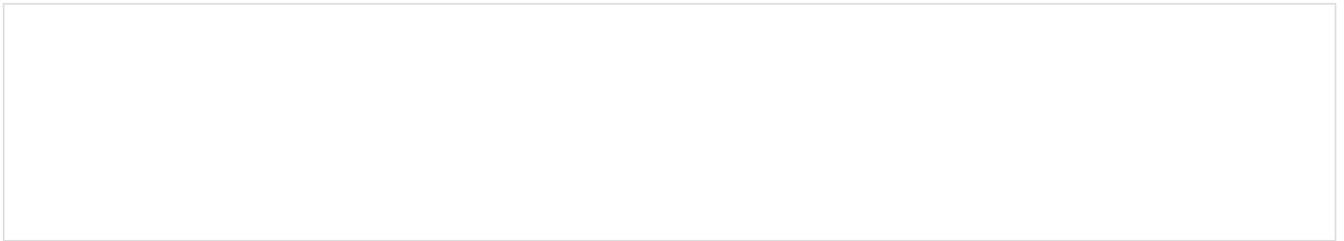
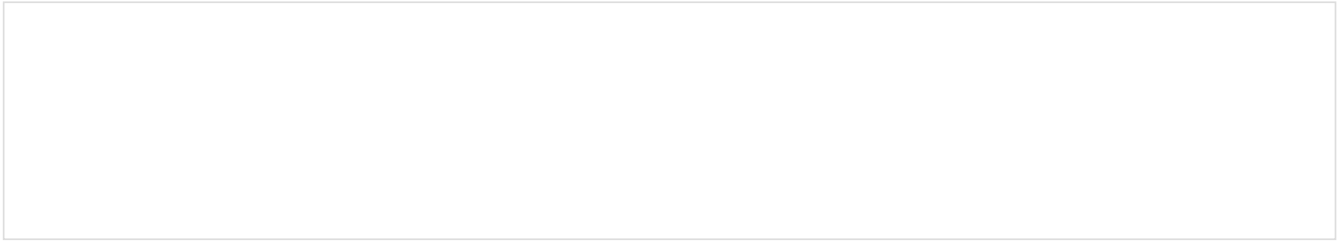
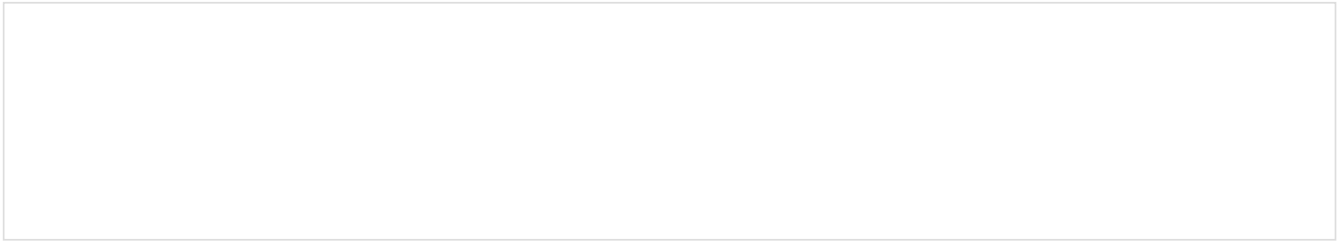
Using the letters you have practiced, create 3-5 simple Arabic words or phrases. You can use the internet or Arabic language resources to find words and their meanings.
