Introduction

Welcome to our "Greetings Around the World" homework sheet! In this activity, you will embark on a linguistic journey to explore how to say "hello" in different languages and contexts. This activity is designed to support your learning objectives of recognizing and repeating basic greetings in English and other languages.

Station 4: Mandarin Nǐ Hǎo


Listen to a native Mandarin speaker say "nǐ hǎo" and repeat it.
