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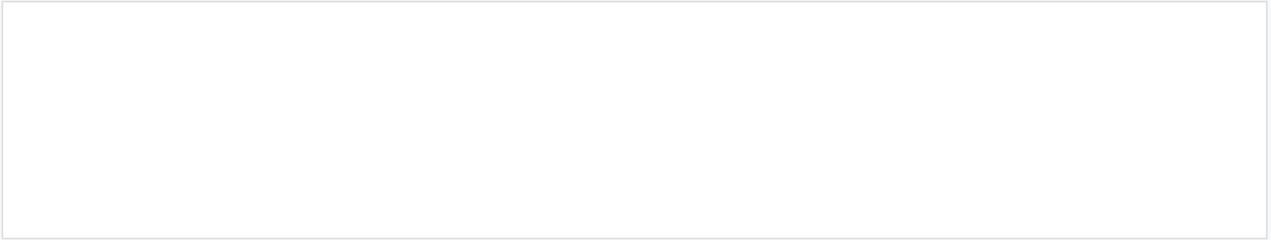
Draw a picture of your favorite mode of transport and explain why you like it.

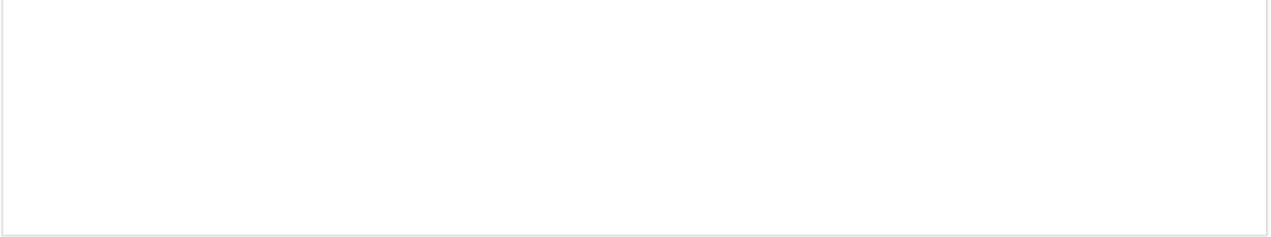
