3. Flip over two cards at a time to try to find a match (uppercase and lowercase of the same letter).
4. If they match, keep the cards; if not, turn them back over.



Activity 4: Create an Alphabet Book

1. Choose a theme (e.g., animals, foods, countries).
2. For each letter of the alphabet, draw or find a picture that starts with that letter (e.g., A for Apple).
3. Write the uppercase and lowercase form of the letter next to the picture.
