Formation of the Past Contentious Tense
The past contentious tense is formed using the auxiliary verb "had" + the past participle of the main verb.  Examples:
<ul> <li>I had thought that the movie was going to be boring, but it was actually really good.</li> <li>She had hoped to get tickets to the concert, but they were sold out.</li> </ul>

Usage of the Past Contentious Tense
The past contentious tense is used to express regret, relief, or surprise about a past situation.  Examples:
<ul> <li>I had expected it to rain, but the sun came out.</li> <li>They had hoped to win the game, but they lost.</li> </ul>
