



Introduction (5 minutes)

Read the introduction and understand the objective of the activity:

In this activity, you will act as reporters describing live scenes and fashion trends. You will use the present continuous tense to describe ongoing actions and events. This will help you practice your grammar skills and develop your public speaking and teamwork abilities.

Warm-Up Exercise (10 minutes)

Watch the video of a live fashion show and describe what you see using the present continuous tense. For example: "The models are walking down the catwalk" or "The audience is cheering."

Role-Play Activity (20 minutes)

Group Task:

You will be divided into groups and assigned a different scenario. You will act as reporters and describe the scene using the present continuous tense. For example:

- Describe a fashion show: "The models are wearing the latest designer clothes" or "The audience is applauding the designer's collection."
- Describe a live event: "The crowd is cheering as the concert begins" or "The band is playing their latest hit song."

Questions and Activities (15 minutes)

Answer the following questions:

1. What is the present continuous tense, and how is it formed?

2. Describe a situation where you would use the present continuous tense to report on a live event.

3. Complete the sentence: "The models _____ (walk) down the catwalk."

Questions and Activities (15 minutes)

Continue answering the questions:

4. Write a short report on a current fashion trend, using the present continuous tense to describe what people are wearing and how trends are changing.

5. Create a short video script describing a live event or fashion show, using the present continuous tense to describe what is happening.

Extension Activities (20 minutes)

Group Task:

Choose one of the following activities:

1. Research and present on a different fashion trend from around the world, using the present continuous tense to describe ongoing trends.
2. Create a news broadcast using the present perfect tense to describe actions that started in the past and continue up to the present.
3. Describe future plans as travel reporters, using future tenses (e.g., will, going to) to talk about plans and predictions.

Assessment (10 minutes)

Your participation in the role-play activity and completion of the questions and activities will be assessed. Your ability to use the present continuous tense correctly and describe ongoing actions and events will be evaluated.

Conclusion (5 minutes)

Individual Reflection:

1. What did you learn about the present continuous tense in this activity?

2. How will you apply what you learned in your everyday conversations?
