Introduction



Cultural heritage refers to the customs, traditions, language, and values that are passed down from one generation to the next. It is what makes us who we are and helps us connect with our families and communities.


Activity 1: Draw a Picture

Activity 2: Write a Sentence


Write a short sentence about what cultural heritage means to you.



Cultural Celebration


Imagine you are planning a cultural celebration. What would you include? (e.g. food, music, decorations)

Draw a picture of your celebration.




Write a short paragraph about what you would do to make it special.
