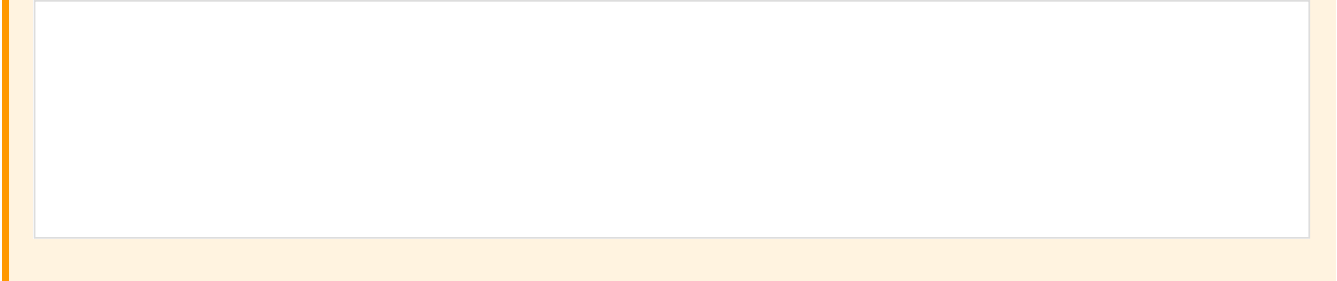
Introduction:
