Key Principles of Effective Communication

Active Listening:

- Giving attention to the speaker
- Paraphrasing and summarizing

Clear Expression of Ideas:

- Using simple and concise language
- Avoiding jargon and technical terms

Conflict Resolution:

- Remaining calm and composed
- Focusing on the issue, not the person

Group Work and Collaboration

Benefits of Group Work:

- Encourages teamwork and collaboration
- Develops problem-solving and critical thinking skills

- Different work styles and personalities
