# **Pre-Lesson Preparation**

#### **Room Setup:**

- Arrange desks in a U-shape
- · Set up technology for multimedia integration

## **Technology Needs:**

- · Computer with internet access
- · Projector and screen

#### **Materials Preparation:**

- · Handouts with guided practice exercises
- · Whiteboard markers

# **Safety Considerations:**

- · Ensure all students have a clear view of the screen
- · Monitor student behavior during group work

## **Detailed Lesson Flow**

## Introduction (10 minutes)

- · Introduce the concept of reading strategies
- · Ask students to share times when they had to read something but didn't understand it well

## **Direct Instruction (20 minutes)**

- Lecture: Explain the purpose of reading strategies, focusing on skimming and scanning
- · Visual Aids: Use diagrams or infographics to illustrate the difference between skimming and scanning

#### **Engagement Strategies:**

- Think-pair-share
- · Group discussion

## **Guided Practice (25 minutes)**

- Provide students with a short text and ask them to practice skimming and scanning in pairs
- Interactive Quiz: Use an online quiz tool to test students' understanding of the difference between skimming and scanning

#### **Scaffolding Strategies:**

· Provide sentence stems for students to use during group work

Offer one-on-one support for students who need it

# **Reading Activity:**

Give students a longer text and ask them to apply the reading strategies learned during the lesson

#### Reflection:

Have students reflect on which strategies worked best for them and why

# **Differentiation Strategies**

## **Learning Centers:**

 Set up centers with different texts and tasks that cater to various learning styles and abilities

## **Technology Integration:**

 Use digital tools that offer text-to-speech functionality for students who struggle with reading

# **Peer Support:**

• Pair students with reading buddies who can assist them in practicing reading strategies





# **Assessment Opportunities**

#### **Formative Assessment:**

- Observe students during guided and independent practice
- Use an online quiz tool to test students' understanding

#### **Summative Assessment:**

• Use the interactive quiz and reflection assignments to evaluate students' ability to apply reading strategies
