- Multiple Choice Questions: 1 point for each correct answer

- Matching Exercises: 1 point for each correct match
- Role-Play Exercise: 10 points for content, 5 points for grammar and pronunciation, and 5 points for interaction and engagement
- Reflection: 5 points for content, 3 points for grammar and spelling, and 2 points for depth of reflection

Differentiation Options

The following differentiation options are available:

- For students with visual impairments: provide large print or braille versions of the assessment materials
