## Introduction to Nouns and Verbs

Welcome to our lesson on nouns and verbs! In this worksheet, we will explore the basics of nouns and verbs and how they are used in sentence structure. A noun is a word that refers to a person, place, thing, or idea. Examples of nouns include:

- Person: John, teacher, student
- Place: school, city, park
- Thing: book, chair, computer
- Idea: happiness, freedom, love

A verb is a word that shows action or a state of being. Examples of verbs include:

- Action: run, jump, read
- State of being: be, seem, appear

Read the following sentences and identify the nouns and verbs:

A sentence is a group of words that expresses a complete thought. A sentence typically has a subject (noun) and a predicate (verb). The subject tells us who or what is performing the action, and the predicate tells us what the subject is doing.

Example: The dog (subject) is barking (predicate).
