

Marking Guide

The marking guide will assess the child's ability to recognize basic shapes and colors, identify numbers 1-5, demonstrate understanding of daily routines and safety rules, and show the ability to follow simple instructions and complete tasks with assistance.

The marking criteria will include:

- Accuracy: The child's ability to correctly identify shapes, colors, and numbers
- Completion: The child's ability to complete tasks with assistance
- Understanding: The child's demonstration of understanding daily routines and safety rules

Implementation Guidelines

The assessment will be administered in a 30-minute session, with the following time allocation:

• Introduction and Instructions: 2 minutes

• Section 1: Math: 10 minutes

• Section 2: Life Skills: 10 minutes

• Section 3: Color Recognition: 5 minutes

• Section 4: Following Instructions: 5 minutes

Administration tips:

- · Ensure the child is comfortable and secure in the assessment environment
- Use simple language and clear instructions
- · Provide assistance as needed
- · Encourage the child to ask questions and seek help when needed

Differentiation Options

To accommodate diverse learners, the following modifications can be made:

- Visual Supports: Provide visual aids, such as pictures or symbols, to support children with language or cognitive difficulties
- Assistive Technology: Use assistive technology, such as text-to-speech software, to support children with physical or sensory disabilities
- Simplified Language: Use simplified language and instructions to support children with language difficulties
- Extra Time: Provide extra time for children who require additional support or accommodations
