- Content (10 points):
 - Does the essay address the topic?
 - Is the essay well-organized and easy to follow?
- Organization (5 points):
 - Is the essay introduction clear and concise?
 - Are the paragraphs well-structured and linked?
- Vocabulary (5 points):
 - Is the vocabulary accurate and appropriate?
 - Are the sentences grammatically correct?
- Grammar and Spelling (10 points):
 - Are the sentences free of grammatical errors?
 - Are the words spelled correctly?
