Introduction to Football

Scoring System and Game Duration

Fouls and Misconduct

Offside and Other Rules

Other rules include the prohibition of using hands and arms to control the ball, except for the goalkeeper, and the requirement to restart play with a kick-off, throw-in, or corner kick after the ball goes out of bounds.

Glossary of Terms

Foul: A rule infringement that results in a free kick or penalty kick being awarded to the opposing team.

Free kick: A kick taken from the spot where a foul was committed.

Penalty kick: A kick taken from the penalty spot, awarded for a major infringement.

Offside: A rule that prohibits a player from staying ahead of the ball and the opposing team's defense.
