- 0 points for each question that demonstrates little or no understanding of the subject matter

### **Section 3: Essay Question**

- 5 points for a well-structured and well-supported essay that demonstrates a clear understanding of the subject matter and the ability to think critically
- 3 points for a good essay that demonstrates a good understanding of the subject matter and some ability to think critically
- 1 point for a fair essay that demonstrates a partial understanding of the subject matter and limited ability to think critically
- 0 points for a poor essay that demonstrates little or no understanding of the subject matter and no ability to think critically
