Benefits of Play-Based Learning

Match the following benefits of play-based learning with their corresponding descriptions:

Benefit	Description
Improved cognitive development	Children develop problem-solving skills and learn to think critically
Enhanced creativity and problem-solving skills	Children develop their imagination and learn to approach problems from different angles
Better social and emotional development	Children develop social skills, such as sharing and cooperation, and learn to manage their emotions
Increased confidence and self-esteem	Children develop a sense of pride and self-worth as they accomplish tasks and achieve goals
Improved academic performance	Children develop a strong foundation in literacy and numeracy skills, leading to improved academic performance
