Pre-Lesson Preparation

Guided Practice

Activity 2: Reflective Journaling

Advanced Activity: Service Project

- Success Criteria: Students are able to design and implement a service project that demonstrates a clear understanding of the Gift or Fruit, and reflects a commitment to applying it in a practical way

Assessment
