2. Why did you like it?
3. What did you learn from the story?

Section 3: Reading Comprehension

Read the following passage and answer the questions:

"The sun was shining brightly in the clear blue sky. A little girl named Lily was playing in the park. She was laughing and having fun."

1. What was the weather like?
2. Who was playing in the park?
3. What was Lily doing?

Activity 3: Reading Charades

Act out a book title or character without speaking. Your partner or group has to guess the title or character.

Section 4: Vocabulary Building

Here are some vocabulary words to help you improve your reading skills:

1. Prediction: A guess about what might happen next in a story.
2. Visualization: Creating mental images based on the text.
3. Summarization: Condensing a text into a shorter summary.

Activity 4: Word Search


Assessment
