



Introduction to Colors

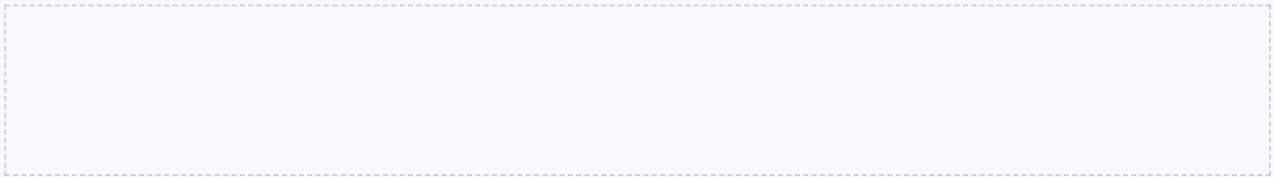
Welcome to the world of colors! This activity sheet is designed to help 4-year-old children learn about primary colors (red, blue, and yellow) and the secondary color green.


