

Welcome to Introduction to English Language Fundamentals

English Language Fundamentals

- Pragmatics: The study of how language is used in social contexts

Vocabulary Building

Grammar Basics

- Parts of speech, including nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs

Pronunciation Practice

To improve pronunciation, students will practice individual sounds and intonation patterns, rhythm and stress in spoken English, and listening and speaking exercises to improve fluency.

Reading Comprehension


To improve reading comprehension, students will read and analyze short texts, identify main ideas and supporting details, and make inferences and draw conclusions based on the text.

Writing Skills

To develop writing skills, students will write short paragraphs using basic sentence structures, practice writing in different contexts, and edit and revise their writing to improve clarity and coherence.


Listening and Speaking

To improve listening and speaking skills, students will listen to and respond to audio recordings and videos, engage in conversations and discussions on various topics, and practice pronunciation and intonation patterns in spoken English.



Assessment and Evaluation

Students will be assessed and evaluated through quizzes and exams, writing assignments and presentations, and class participation and engagement.
