Introduction

Welcome to our lesson on World War 2: Causes, Major Events, and Global Impact. This lesson is designed for UK Primary School students and is tailored to meet the needs of mixed ability learners. The learning objectives for this lesson are:

- To describe the main causes and effects of World War 2
- · To identify key leaders and their roles
- · To analyze the impact of the war on the world

Background Information

World War 2 was a global conflict that lasted from 1939 to 1945, involving most of the world's nations, including all of the great powers. It was the most widespread war in history, with more than 100 million people from over 30 countries participating.
