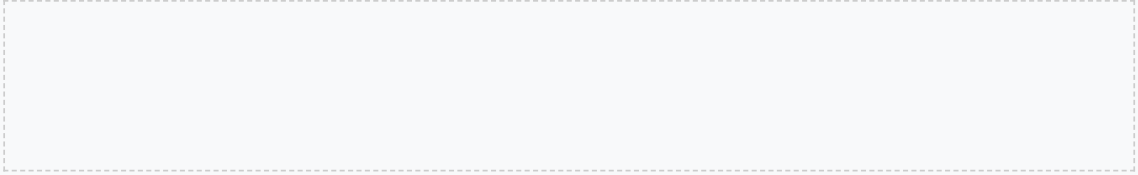
Text 2: Chess
