

# **Teaching Script: Future Tense for Senior ESL Learners**

**Topic:** Future Tense Structures in English **Level:** A1-A2 (Beginner to Elementary)

Student Age: 68+ years

**Duration:** 120 minutes (with built-in rest periods)

Class Size: 8-12 students Learning Objectives:

- Differentiate between 'will', 'going to', and present continuous for future
- Form basic future tense sentences with confidence
- Apply future tenses in real-life contexts
- Engage in simple conversations about future plans
- ✓ Large print handouts (16pt font)
- √ Visual calendar (3 months)
- √ Colored markers
- ✓ Weather forecast images
- ✓ Comfortable seating
- √ Water station
- √ Break-time refreshments
- ✓ Emergency contact list

# **Pre-Lesson Considerations**

## **Senior-Specific Accommodations:**

- Ensure room is well-lit but avoid glare
- Set temperature between 20-22°C (68-72°F)
- Position chairs with good back support
- Plan for frequent micro-breaks
- · Speak clearly at moderate pace

· Have emergency procedures ready

## **Common Challenges for Senior ESL Learners:**

- Difficulty distinguishing between planned and spontaneous future
- Hearing issues affecting comprehension
- · Memory retention concerns
- Anxiety about making mistakes
- Physical comfort during extended lessons

# **Detailed Lesson Script**

### 0-5 minutes

### Warm Welcome Phase

"Good morning everyone! Come in, come in. Mary, there's a comfortable seat here near me. John, how are you today? Would you like some water?"

- Stand by door to greet each student
- Guide to appropriate seating
- Ensure water accessibility
- Monitor room temperature

# **Key Welcome Strategies:**

- · Use students' names frequently
- Speak clearly and face students when talking
- Watch for signs of physical discomfort
- Start building future tense context naturally

#### 5-10 minutes

### Weather Discussion Lead-in

"Let's look at today's weather forecast. The weather report says it will be sunny this afternoon. What do you think? Will it rain today?"

- Point to weather chart
- Use natural gestures

- Write key phrases on board in large text

[Expected: "No, it will be sunny" / "Maybe it will rain"]

#### 10-15 minutes

### Introduction to 'Will' Future

"Now, let's think about tomorrow. I will visit my daughter. This is a decision I'm making right now. Watch my face - I will drink some water. See? I decided this just now."

## **Teaching Points for 'Will':**

- Emphasize spontaneous nature
- · Use clear facial expressions
- · Demonstrate immediate decisions
- Practice contracted forms carefully

# **Individual Support:**

- · Visual learners: Use blue marker for all 'will' examples
- Auditory learners: Repeat with different intonation
- Physical learners: Use hand gestures for 'sudden' decisions

### 15-20 minutes

### Practice Phase: 'Will' Future

"Let's practice together. I'll say something, and you'll respond with 'will'. Ready? 'Oh no, you look thirsty...'"

## [Expected: "I will get you some water"]

- Monitor pronunciation of 'will' vs 'l'll'
- Ensure all students participate
- Provide positive reinforcement
- Note common errors for later review

#### 20-25 minutes

## Introduction to 'Going to' Future

"Now, look at my calendar. I am going to visit my doctor next Tuesday at 2:00. This is a plan. I made this appointment last week."

## Contrast with 'Will':

- Show appointment in calendar
- Emphasize pre-planned nature
- · Use green marker for 'going to'
- · Practice full structure: am/is/are going to

# **Guided Practice Activities**

### 25-35 minutes

# **Calendar Activity**

"Let's look at our monthly calendar together. Each of you has important plans. Maria, you're going to visit your grandchildren next weekend, aren't you? Would you share your plans with us?"

- 1. Display large monthly calendar
- 2. Have students mark their plans with colored stickers
- 3. Practice both 'will' and 'going to' structures
- 4. Write key phrases beside calendar entries

Student: "I am going to visit my grandchildren."

Teacher: "When will you return?"

Student: "I will return on Sunday evening."

#### 35-45 minutes

## **Scheduled Rest Period**

- Light stretching exercises
- Refreshment service
- Bathroom break
- Vision rest
- Social interaction

# Interactive Practice

#### 45-60 minutes

## **Weather Forecast Role-Play**

Students work in pairs to create and present simple weather forecasts using future tenses.

- Weather symbol cards
- City name cards

- Temperature cards
- Simple script template

"Tomorrow will be sunny in Madrid. The temperature is going to reach 25 degrees. People are going to need sunscreen!"

# **Consolidation Activities**

#### 60-75 minutes

## **Future Plans Bingo**

- 1. Distribute large-print bingo cards with future activities
- 2. Students mingle and ask about others' plans
- 3. Mark squares when finding matching plans
- 4. Complete one line for simple bingo
- "Are you going to watch TV tonight?"
- "Will you cook dinner tomorrow?"
- "Are you going to visit family this weekend?"
- "Will you take a walk later?"

#### 75-90 minutes

## **Written Practice**

Guided writing exercise using large-print worksheets

# Assessment and Feedback

### **Informal Assessment Criteria**

- Correct usage of 'will' for spontaneous decisions
- · Appropriate use of 'going to' for plans
- Clear pronunciation of contractions
- · Participation in activities
- · Completion of written tasks

## Lesson Closure

#### 90-105 minutes

## **Review Game: Future Plans Circle**

- 1. Students sit in a comfortable circle
- 2. Each shares one plan using correct structure
- 3. Next person repeats previous plan and adds their own
- 4. Continue until circle is complete

# **Memory Support:**

- Write key phrases on board as spoken
- · Use visual cues when possible
- · Allow peer support
- Keep atmosphere relaxed

### 105-120 minutes

## **Lesson Wrap-Up**

- · Review key structures learned
- Distribute take-home reference sheets
- Preview next lesson's topic
- · Collect feedback cards

# **Optional Home Practice:**

- Write 3 plans for next week
- Watch weather forecast in English
- Practice with family members
