Conclusion (5 minutes)

- Summarize the key points of the lesson
- Ask students to reflect on what they have learned

- Big

Types of Adjectives

Descriptive Adjectives:

- Big
- Happy
- Blue

Quantitative Adjectives:

- Five
- Many
- Few

Demonstrative Adjectives:

- This
- That
- These
- Those



Identifying Adjectives in Sentences

Examples:

- The big house is on the hill
- She is a happy person
- The blue car is mine

Identification:

- Big (descriptive adjective)
- Happy (descriptive adjective)
- Blue (descriptive adjective)

Practice Exercise

Instructions:

Identify the adjectives in the following sentences

Sentences:

- The sun is shining brightly in the clear sky
- The teacher is a kind and patient person
- The book is old and worn



Constructing Sentences using Adjectives

Examples:

- The big red car is mine
- She is a happy and outgoing person
- The old book is on the shelf

Instructions:

Construct your own sentences using the following adjectives

Adjectives:

- Big
- Happy
- Old
