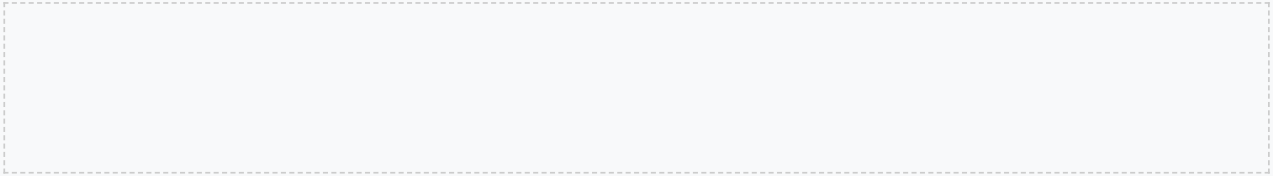

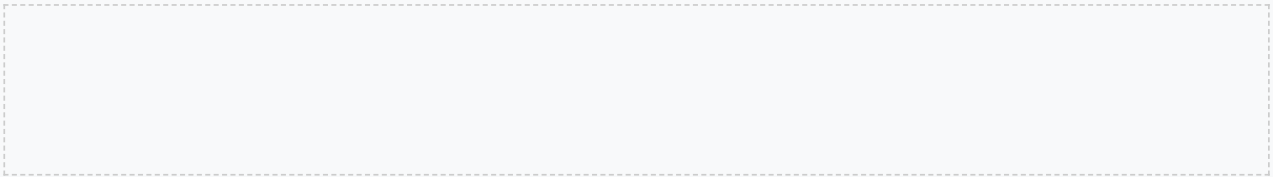

Design a poster or infographic about a Pakistani festival, including its significance, traditions, and customs.

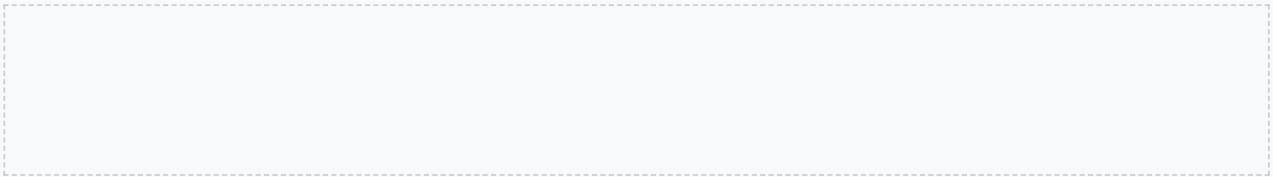

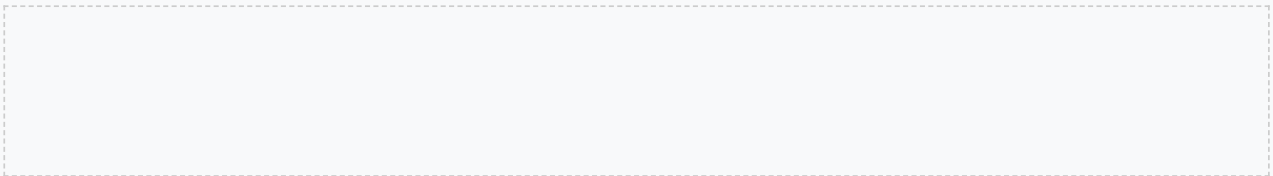


Activity 5: Research and Presentation
