Questions to Reflect On:



Objective: To engage in a cultural exchange with someone from a different background.



3. Share your reflections and thoughts about the cultural differences and similarities you observe.




Activity 7: Cultural Advocacy

Objective: To advocate for cultural understanding and respect within the community.





Final Reflection Essay:




