

# Teaching Script: ABC Adventures (Letters A-C)

Lesson Overview: ABC Adventures - Letters A-C

**Grade Level:** Early Years (Ages 5-6)

**Duration: 30 minutes** 

Focus: Phonics Development, Letter Recognition, Sound Production

**Learning Objectives:** 

· Recognize and identify letters A, B, and C

- Produce correct phonetic sounds (/æ/, /b/, /k/)
- Practice correct letter formation
- Associate letters with common words

✓ Large alphabet cards (A,B,C)	✓ Picture cards
✓ Soft ball	✓ Playdough
✓ Sand tray	✓ Letter formation guides
✓ Student workbooks	✓ Reward stickers

# Pre-Lesson Setup (15 mins before)

# **Room Organization:**

- Create large circle space on carpet
- Set up 3 distinct learning stations:
  - Station 1: Letter Formation (playdough, sand trays)
  - Station 2: Picture Sorting (cards, sorting mats)
  - Station 3: Interactive Writing (whiteboards, markers)
- Display alphabet cards at child's eye level
- Prepare technology/audio for welcome song

#### **Preparation Tips:**

- Test all audio/visual equipment
- Ensure fresh playdough is soft and ready
- Pre-sort picture cards for quick access
- Have spare materials readily available

# Welcome and Warm-Up (Minutes 0-5)

"Good morning letter learners! Today we're going on an alphabet adventure!"

- 1. Use transition song: "1-2-3, come sit with me"
- 2. Guide students to sitting spots using name cards
- 3. Begin ABC Welcome Song with actions:

☐ A-B-C, come learn with me, Letters make sounds, just wait and see! Listening ears and watching eyes, Letter learning is such a prize! ☐

# **Engagement Strategies:**

- Use animated facial expressions
- Incorporate hand motions
- Maintain eye contact with all students
- Use varied voice pitch for excitement

# **Support Strategies:**

- Visual cues for ELL students
- Gesture support for actions
- Buddy pairing for hesitant participants

# Letter A Focus (Minutes 5-10)

"Let's meet our first letter friend - Amazing A!"

# **Letter A Introduction Sequence:**

- 1. Display large 'A' card
- 2. Model sound: "A makes the /æ/ sound, like this..." (exaggerate mouth position)
- 3. Guide air writing: "Big line down, big line down, line across"
- 4. Tell "Annie Ant" story:

"Annie Ant was always active, Searching apples day and night. Up and down and across she went, Making A's with all her might!"

"Now, let's be sound detectives! When I show a picture, if it starts with /æ/, give me a quiet thumb up!"

#### **Picture Card Sequence:**

- Apple (yes) "A-a-apple"
- Ball (no) "B-b-ball"
- Ant (yes) "A-a-ant"
- Astronaut (yes) "A-a-astronaut"
- Cat (no) "C-c-cat"

#### Watch for:

- Confusion between 'A' sound and letter name
- Difficulty with letter orientation
- Hesitation in sound recognition

#### **Quick Interventions:**

- Use hand mirror for sound formation
- Provide tactile letter traces
- Offer immediate gentle correction

# Letter B Focus (Minutes 10-15)

"Now let's bounce over to Bouncy B!"

#### **Letter B Introduction Sequence:**

- 1. Display large 'B' card
- 2. Model sound: "/b/ like a bouncing ball" (demonstrate lip position)
- 3. Guide formation: "Down the line, around twice, make it neat!"
- 4. Present "Bobby Bear" story:

"Bobby Bear loved bouncing balls, Big and bright and blue! Down he went and round he turned, Making B's so true!"

#### **Bounce and Learn Game:**

- · Students stand in circle
- Bounce ball to student while saying "/b/"
- Student catches and names a word starting with B
- Continue around circle

# **Target B Words:**

- ball
- baby
- book
- banana
- butterfly
- boat

# Letter C Focus (Minutes 15-20)

"Time to meet Curvy C!"

#### **Letter C Introduction:**

- 1. Display large 'C' card
- 2. Model sound: "/k/ like a coughing cat" (demonstrate)
- 3. Guide formation: "Curve around like a cup"
- 4. Share "Clever Cat" story:

"Clever Cat curved round and round, Creating C's upon the ground. Catching cookies, cream, and cake, Curving C's were fun to make!"

# **Body Letter Formation:**

- Students stand in semi-circle
- Use arms to make big C shape
- Turn bodies into C shape
- Practice with partner

# Interactive Practice (Minutes 20-25)

# **Station 1: Sensory Letter Formation**

- Playdough letter making
- Sand tray practice
- Finger painting options

#### **Station 2: Sound Sorting**

- Picture card categorization
- Sound matching games
- Beginning sound identification

# **Station 3: Writing Practice**

- Letter formation worksheets
- Whiteboard practice
- Rainbow writing

# **Station Management:**

- Use timer for rotations
- Clear transition signal
- Visual instruction cards
- Helper at each station

# **Accommodation Strategies:**

- Larger writing tools for motor skills
- Simplified worksheets available
- Extended time options
- Modified materials for support

# Assessment & Closure (Minutes 25-30)

# **Quick Check Understanding:**

- Letter recognition flash cards
- Sound production assessment
- Basic writing evaluation

# **Letter Review Game:**

- 1. Show letter card
- 2. Students make sound
- 3. Give action for letter:
  - A Stand tall like an A
  - B Bounce like a ball
  - C Curve like a cat

# **Additional Learning Opportunities:**

- Letter Hunt:
  - Magazine letter finding
  - Environmental print identification
  - Letter photography project
- · Creative Writing:
  - Letter story creation
  - Alphabet book making
  - Letter character drawings
- Digital Integration:
  - Interactive letter apps
  - Online letter games
  - Digital letter tracing

# **Family Engagement Activities:**

- Letter of the Day:
  - Morning hunt for letter
  - Letter-themed snacks
  - Letter object collection
- Practice Suggestions:
  - Kitchen letter writing (flour/sugar)
  - Bath time letter practice
  - Outdoor letter hunt

Dear Families, This week we explored letters A, B, and C! Your child learned: - Letter sounds and formations - Words beginning with each letter - Fun letter-themed songs and stories Please practice these letters at home using the suggested activities. Next week we'll explore letters D, E, and F!

# **Lesson Conclusion**

"Wonderful work today, letter learners! Let's review what we learned!"

#### **Final Review:**

- Quick sound review: /æ/
- Air-write letter 'A' together
- Celebrate learning with "Letter A Victory Dance"

# **Exit Activity:**

- Students whisper their favorite 'A' word
- Receive "Letter A Expert" sticker
- Pack materials in alphabet folders

Remember: Next lesson will focus on letters D-F!

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
