Introduction

Create your own short story incorporating at least 3 pairs of synonyms and antonyms.

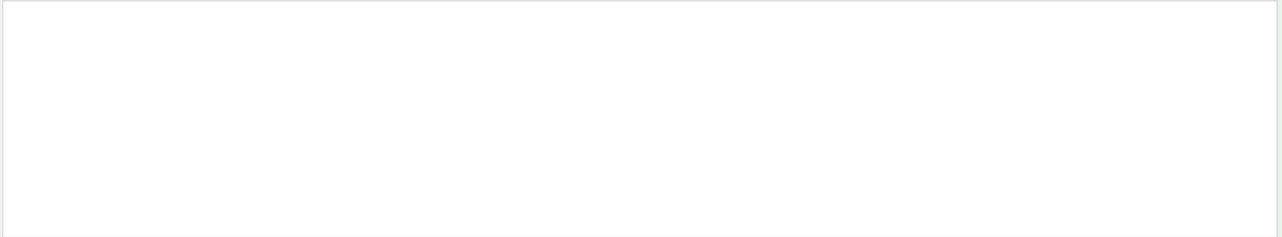
