English Alphabet

The English alphabet consists of 26 letters, each with its unique sound and pronunciation. Let's start with the basics!

Alphabet Tracing:

Practice tracing the English alphabet using the following worksheet:

Letter	Upper Case	Lower Case
A	A	a
B	B	b
C	C	c

Pronunciation Practice

Listen to the audio recordings and practice pronouncing each letter:

- 1. A /æ/
- 2. B /b/
- 3. C /k/

Vocabulary Building

Let's build your vocabulary with some common words that start with each letter of the alphabet:

Letter	Word
A	Apple
B	Boy
C	Cat

"The sun is shining brightly in the sky. The cat is sleeping on the mat. The dog is barking loudly outside."

2. Where is the cat sleeping?
