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# Introduction to Family and Cultural Heritage through Visual Aids and Storytelling

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## Introduction

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Introduction to Family and Cultural Heritage through Visual Aids and Storytelling is a lesson plan designed to introduce 5-year-old students to the concept of family and cultural heritage. 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## Guided Practice

- Family Tree Creation
- Cultural Artifact Sorting
- Storytelling with Pictures
- Family Tradition Interview
- Cultural Mural Creation



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## Independent Practice

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The independent practice section will consist of 4 differentiated activities designed to support students in exploring their family and cultural heritage through visual aids and storytelling. These activities include:

- Beginner Activity: Family Member Matching
- Intermediate Activity: Cultural Artifact Research
- Advanced Activity: Personal Storytelling
- ELL/ESL Activity: Visual Vocabulary Building



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## Subject Knowledge

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The subject knowledge section will provide 4 comprehensive pieces of information, each 150+ words, covering fundamental concepts and applications related to family and cultural heritage. These concepts include:

- Family Structures
- Cultural Heritage
- Storytelling
