Introduction (10 minutes)

1. Which psychosexual stage is most relevant to this individual's behavior, and why?
2. How might this individual's experiences during the anal stage have contributed to their current behavior?
Group Discussion (20 minutes)
Group Task:
Divide into small groups and discuss the following questions:
How do the oral and anal stages influence adult behaviors and relationships?
What are the potential consequences of unresolved issues during these stages, and how can they be addressed?
