Comprehension Questions

Literary Analysis

Creative Writing

Create your own story or character, using the connected series or junior journal as inspiration. Write a short story (approx. 250-500 words) and illustrate it with pictures or diagrams.

Book Review

Write a book review, evaluating the strengths and weaknesses of the text and making recommendations for other readers. Write a short review (approx. 100-200 words) and include a rating system (e.g. 1-5 stars).

Comprehension Games

Play comprehension games, such as "Comprehension Charades" or "Reading Bingo", to reinforce comprehension skills.

Reading Log

Keep a reading log, recording the title of the book, the author, and a brief summary of what you read. Reflect on your reading habits and set goals for future improvement.

Vocabulary Building
