- Section 1: Multiple Choice Questions (30 points)
 - 1 point for each correct answer
 - o 0 points for each incorrect answer
- Section 2: Short Answer Questions (40 points)
 - o 2-3 points for each correct answer, depending on the complexity of the question
 - \circ 0-1 point for each incorrect answer, depending on the quality of the response
- Section 3: Essay Question (30 points)
 - 10 points for content, including vocabulary usage, grammar, and coherence
 - o 10 points for organization and structure
 - o 10 points for language use, including spelling, punctuation, and syntax
